

CUPS FLAKED TUNA FISH 1/2 CUP MAYONNAISE OR SALAD DRESSING 1/2 CUP CELERY, DICED 1/2 CUP PEAS

2 TABLESPOONS SWEET PICKLE, CHOPPED 2 TABLESPOONS ONION, CHOPPED 3 HARD COOKED EGGS, DICED

LETTUCE

COMBINE FIRST 7 INGREDIENTS, BEING CAREFUL NOT TO BREAK THE FISH INTO TOO SMALL PIECES. SERVE ON LETTUCE CUPS, AND GARNISH WITH SLICED EGGS. SERVES 6.
