COVER: "SHRIMP BOATS" OF POPULAR-SONG FAME IN PORT AT BROWNSVILLE, TEXAS--ONE OF THE IMPORTANT SHRIMP PORTS IN THE GULF AREA. OVER 7,000 BOATS AND VESSELS (MOST OF WHICH RANGE FROM 35 TO 75 FEET IN LENGTH) ARE ENGAGED IN CATCHING SHRIMP IN GULF AND SOUTH ATLANTIC WATERS. THE SHRIMP INDUSTRY HAS BEEN AIDED IN LOCATING ADDITIONAL SHRIMP RESOURCES IN THE GULF OF MEXICO BY THE U.S. FISH AND WILDLIFE SERVICE EXPLORATORY VESSEL OREGON. IT HAS DISCOVERED NEW SHRIMP GROUNDS WHICH INDICATE THAT THE ACTUAL POTENTIAL OF THE SHRIMP FISHERIES HAS NOT YET BEEN REALIZED. INTEREST IN THE EXPLOITATION OF SHRIMP RESOURCES OFF ALASKA, CALIFORNIA, AND NEW ENGLAND ALSO HAS BEEN REPORTED. IT SEEMS THAT THE OUTLOOK FOR NEW SHRIMP RESOURCES IS GOOD.
