COVER: A large Russian fishing fleet was reported operating late in March and early in April off Alaska's Bristol Bay. The fleet was said to consist of 50 trawlers and auxiliary or mothership vessels. A Russian trawler and large mothership vessel are shown side by side in this aerial photo. The fleet was operating northeast of the Unimak Island to Pribilof Islands deep-water trench. Since United States and Canadian vessels fish the trench area extensively, they probably have sighted some of the Russian vessels.
