COVER: Gill-net boats stacked on the deck of a cargo vessel bound for Alaska. The cargo consists of 99 vessels. About 210 (150 were built in the Seattle, Wash., area) of these new gill-netters were completed early this year in time principally for the salmon season in the Bristol Bay area of Alaska. The run of sockeye or red salmon in that area this season is expected to be as good if not better than in 1960. The new gill-net vessels are built to carry 6,000 red salmon (about 30,000 pounds). Powered by a 94 hp. turbo-charged Diesel engine, the vessels have a speed of 13.2 knots.
