COVER: Shows the crew of the Alaskan herring seiner American Star stacking the seine on the deck of the vessel. It has a crew of 8, consisting of captain, engineer, cook, and 5 deckhands. Nine such vessels fished for herring out of southeastern Alaska ports in 1964. All are of the same type--between 75 and 85 feet long, with the larger vessels capable of storing 900 to 1,200 barrels below decks.
