Cover.—Pink salmon alevins seen through a plexiglass wall of an experimental incubator at the NMFS Auke Bay laboratory which utilizes AstroTurf as a substrate. The photograph was taken about 2 weeks after the alevins had hatched. The alevins are about 20mm long and the tufts of the AstroTurf are about 25mm long. The original photograph was taken by Sidney G. Taylor on 35-mm Kodachrome X film with a Minolta SRT-101 camera, using a Rokkor macro lens at f3.5 and 1/60 second and a Vivitar auto flash.
