MDL - Market development lists of frozen food locker plants and locker associations.



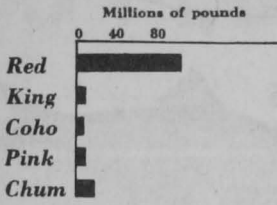

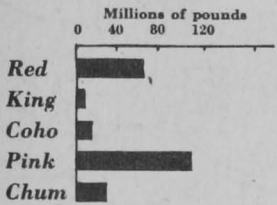

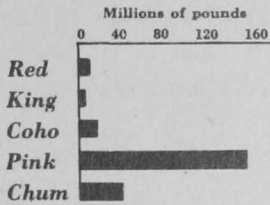


BRISTOL BAY

130 million pounds

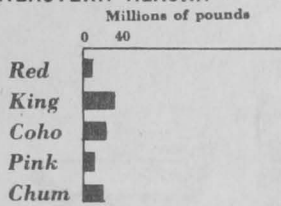
Japanese vessels fished in Bristol Bay from 1930 to 1941 for king crabs, bottom fish, and to some extent for salmon.



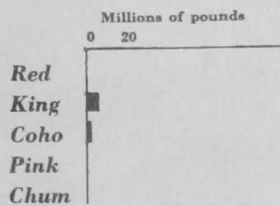
WESTERN ALASKA

5 million pounds

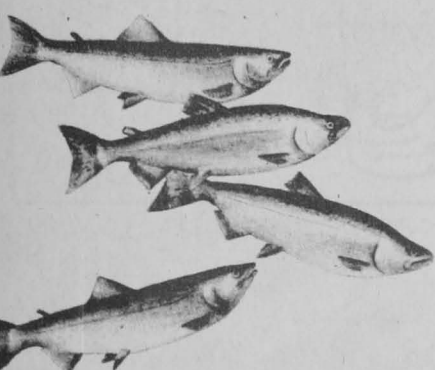
